Book Synopsis

The colonial history and multilingual context of Pakistan make Language Policy and Planning a central theme in our academic, social, and political arenas invoking sentiments and concerns that have resulted in complexities. Owing to a dearth of experts and academics on the subject and largely because of the absence of platforms and opportunities, LPP issues and perspectives have remained unaddressed particularly objective and rational revisitation in the contemporary twenty-first century realities and developments. This situation has made an already sensitive matter to a contentious one that underscores the need for academic and critical deliberations on the subject and its multifaceted underlying contextual realities. Also, LPP is viewed as the tipping point that shapes the subsequent ideologies, frameworks, and practices concerning language pedagogy, instructional design, classroom practices, materials, and testing. With this brief overview, the editors invite **original contributions from experts, academics, and researchers** interested or involved in theoretical or empirical research on Language policy and planning in the multilingual Pakistani context focusing on any of the following three major critical aspects: **Policies, Praxes, and Perspectives**.

- Language education policy
- Language policy development and policy implementation.

- Praxes of LPP implementation
- Humanizing language policy, LPP and stakeholder engagement, LPP and the culture and context, LPP and the social development, good practices and the ethical dimensions, challenges, constraints and realities, perspectives of state and communities, politics of language policy, etc.

Book Chapter Proposal Submission:

Interested individuals may submit a carefully developed proposal that clearly establishes a link with the book title **(LPP)**, its focused aspects **(policies, praxes, and practices)** and the topics listed above. The proposals should be critically evaluated before submission for: a) focusing on original analytical/empirical research that has implications for specific stakeholders in the local context; and, b) scientific and academic language and style and standard written English.

- 1. Title of the proposed book chapter
- 2. Topic to which it is classified (from the list above); and the aspect to which its is classified (policies, praxes, perspectives)'
- 3. Proposal Description: 500 to 750 words description that may cover the applicable elements: problem, aims, scope, contribution, theory, methods, population/sample/context, data analysis, conclusion etc.
- 4. Author Details: Names, designation, affiliation, email address, and cell number of every author. Clearly mention them as first, second, third, and fourth author and also indicate the corresponding author from amongst the listed authors. Proposals with more than four authors will not be considered.
